

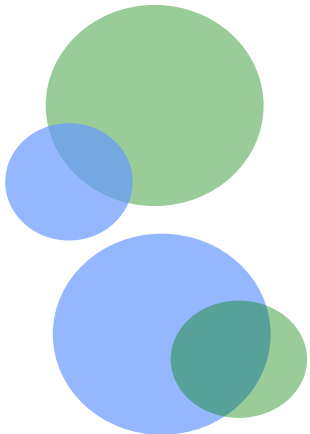

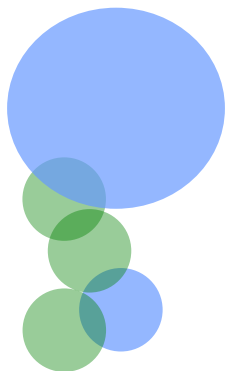


Class 1 will be doing the same trip on Tuesday next week.
