

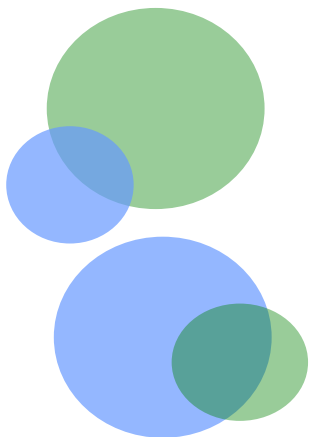

This/Last week in school

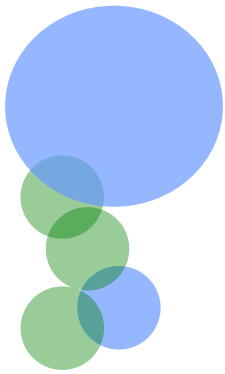
